

Dear Talmud Torah Families,

Summer will soon be upon us and the Camp and Israel Scholarship deadline is right around the corner.

The Talmud Torah of Minneapolis has long supported attendance of our youth at Jewish camps and national programs of travel and study in Israel as a means of further enriching their Jewish education. Our strong commitment to this support is evident by our long history of providing financial aid through the Talmud Torah Scholarship Fund.

The criteria for financial assistance are as follows:

1. Only full time students in attendance at Talmud Torah are eligible.
2. Aid will be given for recognized programs in Israel directly associated with Jewish education.
3. The Talmud Torah will provide one scholarship grant per student for a recognized Education in Israel Experience.
4. Any student accepting an Israel Experience scholarship must commit to completing the Bet Midrash program or be responsible for refunding the school for the amount awarded.
5. The child must be registered for camp at the time the scholarship application is submitted in order to be considered.
6. Your Talmud Torah tuition must be current or you have a payment plan agreement.
